PASTORS' LETTER



Dear friends,

One of the perks of being a Cook Children's "preemie" (AKA: a baby born prematurely) is the uncommon care that

goes into serving them even after they discharge from the hospital. Our twin preemies have had numerous follow-up appointments at the incredible NEST Clinic in Cook's beautiful Dodson building. Just this past December, our twins took a huge developmental test, which was hours long. Upon receiving the results from this test in the mail, Annie and I were amused to see that our 2-year-old son scored "superior" in the category of emotional development! This still makes me laugh for a couple reasons: One, thinking of a toddler's emotional intelligence as superior is simply a crack up! Two, I was the parent in the room for Shep's developmental test, and I remember at one point he hopped off my lap, ran to the door and while fiddling with the door knob, he told the doctor those honest-confident-unfiltered words of a toddler: "Bye bye!" In other words, "See ya later doc, I'm outta here!"

Well, after we put Shep's "superior" emotional test score on the fridge, we began to notice some of the possible signs. One sign was, perhaps, that Shep quickly reached the developmental stage of being afraid and, in turn, voicing his fear. "I'm scared" is something he was saying on a regular basis. Walking down a dark hallway in our home, "I'm scared." Hearing a loud noise, "I'm scared." Seeing his sister's face after stealing one of her toys, "I'm scared." (Kidding about that last one.) One story I'll never forget is being at the park down the street when Shep got on the climbing ladder of the jungle gym. He announced, "I'm scared." As usual, I approached him and thought about all the times Annie or I would hold him and boost him up the ladder while, at the same time, allowing him to feel like he was climbing and experience a sense of semi-accomplishment. This time, I tried something new. Instead of doing the climbing work for him, all I did was put my hand on his back. I just gently touched his back, enough pressure for him to know I was there but light enough not to be actually helping him climb up the ladder. The result? Something amazing happened: he scrambled up that ladder like a professional rock climber! Then I realized, in the moment, all this child needed was to know his father was there for him. Just a hand on his back was all it took to give him the trust in his father he needed to let go of his fear and engage the challenge set

before him. In a nutshell, this it what it means to trust God and fear less.

As you know, "Fear Less" was the theme of our Youth Group's recent Youth Sunday! I hope you were as moved as I was by the leadership of our congregation's young people. From writing prayers and liturgy to sharing their musical gifts to offering thoughtful sermons to picking all the hymns we sang, our youth reminded us of our common calling to trust God and fear less. While this doesn't mean we have no fear whatsoever in this life, as our senior preachers reminded us, it does mean that in the face of life's challenging tasks and difficult moments, we can put our trust in God and let go of fear. By trusting God, we find freedom from unhealthy fear and the courage to risk

moving forward in faith. Then, by the grace of God, we discover ourselves doing what had once seemed impossible.

In the New Testament, the most common command of Jesus Christ is to let go of fear. Jesus said this in a number of ways: "do not fear," "do not be afraid," "take heart," "have courage." Of course, this message is scattered all over the Old Testament too. For example, Psalm 23 reminds us to



fear no evil as we trust our Good Shepherd through the darkest valleys of life. If saying something repeatedly is any indicator of importance, we can be sure that God takes our fears seriously. So, the next time you find yourself going through a dark valley of life, take a moment. Close your eyes. Remember God is with you. Imagine the Good Shepherd's hand is gently placed on your back. Let go of your fear, and risk doing this one radicalcountercultural-childlike thing: trust God.

HAITI MISSION TRIP: April 2-9

A team of 8 FPC members traveled to Cheridant, Haiti and installed a solar panel system for a newly-constructed high school alongside Solar for the Sun -- Solar's biggest project to date!

Presbyterian Women's Work Gains National Attention

The Presbyterian Women of First Presbyterian Church and their ongoing work with providing clean water to the people of Haiti gained national attention in the March/April 2018 issue of *Horizons*, the publication for the national organization of Presbyterian Women.

Written by FPC's Carol Long, the article opens with, "Clean water from recently drilled wells flows steadily in Haiti thanks to the new 'Presbyterian drill rig.' In 2016, Presbyterian Women of [FPC] received a \$40,250 Thank Offering grant to help fund a portable water well drill rig to be used with their partner, Living Water International." As you may remember from previous *Penn Street Letter* articles on this exciting mission, the grant was supplemented by gifts from FPC, four other Presbyterian churches, and two Texas families that made it possible to purchase a \$100,000 trailer-mounted drill rig.

Between February 2017 and February 2018, 27 new water wells have been funded, drilled, and completed. Each well serves 300-500 people, equalling convenient access to safe water for approximately 11,500 Haitians.

The article goes on to tell of FPC's water well drill team that will travel to El Salvador in August of this year with Living Water International to continue the mission of providing clean water started by efforts of our Presbyterian Women.
