AN UPDATE FROM THE SANCTUARY **IMPROVEMENT TEAM**

We have been worshipping in the sanctuary again since November, but our project isn't quite complete. Below is some information about what is vet to come.

There are some items that haven't been delivered or installed yet. Just when we got used to sitting a couple of inches lower in the pews, the pew cushions arrived. I know we will all be glad to be sitting tall and comfy once again! We also have some doors that haven't been installed yet, including a vented door for the audio closet in the sacristy. The roof tiles have not been totally reinstalled yet.

We still have some adjustments to make with the various systems. The sound system will be fully tuned now that the pew cushions have arrived. The professionals will continue to tweak the microphone and speaker levels until we are satisfied. We are also checking into other microphone options to make sure we have the ones that work best for our clergy.

Our entire team - architect, contractor, committee and staff, is committed to making sure all of the loose ends are tied up and the project finalized to our satisfaction. I believe I can speak for the entire committee when I say it has been an honor to work on this project. We are proud of our work and thankful for the church leadership and professionals who continue to work alongside us.

PASTORS' LETTER



Dear friends.

Robyn Michalove's sermon (January 13) on Jesus' baptism centered our attention on God's voice saying to Jesus, "You are my Beloved." She encouraged and invited us to spend time reflecting on the reality that, as we share in the baptismal waters with Jesus, we too hear God's voice calling us Beloved. We are God's Beloved, named and claimed in our baptisms. Each of us

are God's Beloved. And together God's Beloved community.

As we journey together through this year of pastoral transition at First Presbyterian, we will do well to nurture in one another the reality that we are God's Beloved. Each of us and all of us. We are God's Beloved. As you reflect on your Belovedness as God's own, these words from Henri Nouwen's spiritual classic Life of the Beloved may inspire you as he reflects on hearing God's voice in his own life.

"I have called you by name, from the very beginning. You are mine and I am yours. You are my Beloved, on you my favor rests. I have molded you from the depths of the earth and knitted you together in your mother's womb. I have carved you in the palms of my hands and hidden you in the shadow of my embrace. I look at you with infinite tenderness and care for you with a care more intimate than that of a mother... Wherever you go, I go with you, and wherever you rest, I keep watch. I will give you food that will satisfy all your hunger and drink that will quench all your thirst. I will not hide my face from you. You know me as your own as I know you as my own. You belong to me... Nothing will separate us. We are one." (Life of the Beloved, pp.36-37)

We belong to God. God is with us. Commit to living that reality and truth in your life, and each time we gather together in worship, in classes, in service to the world, and in caring for one another. Especially during this time of transition and change. We are God's Beloved and that is more than enough.

A Message from the **Personnel Committee**

The Personnel Committee of First Presbyterian Church writes to inform the congregation of some administrative actions that have occurred since Karl has gone on disability for health reasons. A staffing plan was put in place last year to handle extended absences by our Pastor/Head of Staff. The plan was created with input from Karl and the program staff. We have implemented that plan effective January 2, 2019.

The Staffing Plan addresses Administrative Responsibilities, Worship Responsibilities and Care of Staff.

Administrative Responsibilities:

- Michael Waschevski will be Acting Head of Staff for clergy, program, children's ministry/EEC and music.
- Dana Fickling will be Acting Head of Staff for support staff, maintenance and hospitality.

Worship Responsibilities:

- Robyn Michalove will preach each Sunday unless unavailable. Michael and Josh will rotate preaching responsibilities in the event of Robyn's unavailability.
- Michael will oversee the selection and preparation of worship music.

Care of Staff:

- The Personnel Committee has assigned personal liaisons for each staff member who reported directly to Karl. The liaisons will meet, listen, and care for their respective staff member during this period of transition.
- The Chair of the Personnel Committee will meet with Michael and Dana onsite at least weekly to address any administrative issues.
- CIGNA has made available for the entire staff a mental health counselor, if needed, as part of our insurance coverage.

We at First Presbyterian are truly blessed with an extremely competent and talented staff that has willingly stepped up to the challenge. It is very important for us as a congregation to do everything we can to love and support our staff as we move forward. The members of the Personnel Committee welcome your questions or concerns and will do our best to address them.

An Interim Search Committee has been elected by the Session to interview candidates for Interim Head of Staff.

PEANUT BUTTER
